RIPE AND TASTY: JUNE – AUG

Look for:

Plump fruit that is uniform in color. Avoid berries that are moldy, crushed, or bruised.



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AT HOME:
Cover unwashed berries and store in the refrigerator for up to two days.

TO USE:
Cover berries with water and gently lift from the container. Remove stems and drain on paper towels.

READY TO EAT:
Enjoy fresh blackberries alone, in salads, on cereal, with yogurt or in smoothies. May be cooked into baked goods.

Recipe of the Month Blueberry Cheesecake Bars

Ingredients:

Crust

- 1 cup graham cracker crumbs
- 3 Tbsp. unsalted butter, melted
- 3 Tbsp. unsweetened applesauce

Topping

- 1 1/2 cups nonfat plain Greek yogurt
- 3.5 oz. cream cheese, softened
- 1 Tbsp. cornstarch
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 1/3 cup sugar
- 2 Tbsp. lemon juice
- 2 cups blueberries
- 1 Tbsp. lemon zest (optional)

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 300 degrees F.
2. Wash hands with warm water and soap, scrubbing for at least 20 seconds.
3. Mix graham cracker crumbs, melted butter, and applesauce together in a medium bowl until combined. Evenly press crust into an 8x8 baking pan. Firmly press down on the crust with a dry measuring cup to make it more compact.
4. Bake for 12 minutes. Remove from oven and set aside.
5. Increase the oven temperature to 350 degrees F.
6. In a large bowl, combine the yogurt, softened cream cheese, corn starch, salt, sugar and lemon juice. Fold in the blueberries and lemon zest (if using).
7. Carefully drop spoonfuls of the topping mixture over the cooled crust and spread to make an even layer.
8. Bake for 35 minutes or until it does not jiggle. Remove from oven and let cool completely. For best results, refrigerate 1 hour before cutting.
9. Store in the refrigerator.

 3. No entry fee will be charged.
 4. Only **ONE ENTRY PER CLASS PER EXHIBITOR**. No limit to number of classes or departments in which exhibitor enters.
 5. No class changes will be allowed. Items not suitable for listed classes will be accepted for **DISPLAY ONLY**.
 6. No entries by professionals will be accepted unless class is so specified. **Professional** - anyone who sells or who has received payments for that type of item on a regular basis. **Amateur** - anyone who has never received payment for/or sold that type of item.
 7. All entries must be entered under the name of the person who made/grew the item.
 8. If an entry does not warrant a premium, one will not be awarded.
 9. Champion and Grand Champion Awards are at the discretion of the judges.
 10. Decisions of the judges are final.
- **RECEIVING ENTRIES:** All open exhibit entries will be received on **Wednesday, June 14th from 9:00 a.m. until 12 noon** at the Gallatin County Fair Grounds.
 - Exhibit Building will be open to the public June 15 & 16th from 4:00 p.m. - 9:00 p.m. If you have entries of great monetary value, please use judgement in leaving them on display. **Items will not be under surveillance at all times**
 - **RELEASING ENTRIES:** Friday, June 16th between 7:00 and 9:00 pm.

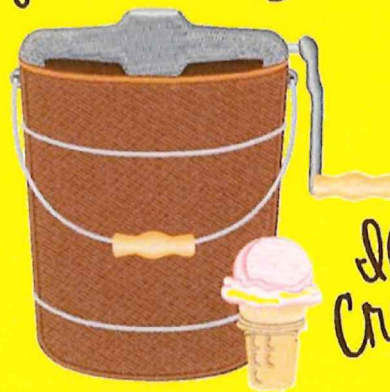
