RIPE AND TASTY: JUNE - AUG

Look for:

Plump fruit that is uniform in color. Avoid berries that are moldy, crushed, or bruised.

AT HOME: Cover unwashed berries and store in the refrigerator for up to two days.

TO USE: Cover berries with water and gently lift from the container. Remove stems and drain on paper towels.

> READY TO EAT: Enjoy fresh blackberries alone, in salads, on cereal, with yogurt or in smoothies. May be cooked into baked goods.

# Recipe of the Month Blueberry Cheesecake Bars

### Ingredients:

### Crust

- 1 cup graham cracker crumbs
- 3 Tbsp. unsalted butter, melted
- 3 Tbsp. unsweetened applesauce

### Topping

- 1 1/2 cups nonfat plain Greek yogurt
- 3.5 oz. cream cheese, softened
- 1 Tbsp. cornstarch
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 1/3 cup sugar
- 2 Tbsp. lemon juice
- 2 cups blueberries
- 1 Tbsp. lemon zest (optional)

### Directions:

- Preheat oven to 300 degrees F.
- Wash hands with warm water and soap, scrubbing for at least 20 seconds.
- Mix graham cracker crumbs, melted butter, and applesauce together in a medium bowl until combined. Evenly press crust into an 8x8 baking pan. Firmly press down on the crust with a dry measuring cup to make it more compact.
- 4. Bake for 12 minutes. Remove from oven and set aside.
- Increase the oven temperature to 350 degrees F.
- In a large bowl, combine the yogurt, softened cream cheese, corn starch, salt, sugar and lemon juice. Fold in the blueberries and lemon zest (if using).
- Carefully drop spoonfuls of the topping mixture over the cooled crust and spread to make an even layer.
- 8. Bake for 35 minutes or until it does not jiggle. Remove from oven and let cool completely. For best results, refrigerate 1 hour before cutting.
- 9. Store in the refrigerator.

- 6. No entries by professionals will be accepted unless class is so specified. Professional anyone who sells or who has received payments for that type of item on a regular basis. Amateur anyone who has never received payment for/or sold that type of item.
- 7. All entries must be entered under the name of the person who made/grew the item.
- 8. If an entry does not warrant a premium, one will not be awarded.
- 9. Champion and Grand Champion Awards are at the discretion of the judges.
- 10. Decisions of the judges are final.
- RECEIVING ENTRIES: All open exhibit entries will be received on Wednesday, June 14th from 9:00 a.m. until 12 noon at the Gallatin County Fair Grounds.
- Exhibit Building will be open to the public June 15 & 16<sup>th</sup> from 4:00 p.m. 9:00 p.m. If you have entries of great monetary value, please use judgement in leaving them on display. **Items will not be under surveillance at all times**


